4	<p>Only a handful of developed countries still sanction capital punishment. Japan should abolish this cruel and extreme practice, particularly considering the issues of wrongful executions and human rights, and also the fact that the practice offers no benefit to society.</p> <p>As a nation that values justice, Japan should not take the risk of executing someone and subsequently having evidence that exonerates that person surface. Wrongful imprisonment would be bad enough, but at least efforts could be made to compensate the wronged individual. If an innocent person is executed, however, nothing can be done to make up for it.</p> <p>Another reason to abolish capital punishment is its violation of the right to life. No matter how heinous the crime, a peace-loving nation such as Japan should not condone human-rights violations. It is impossible to kill someone humanely, and hanging is particularly brutal. Execution also constitutes psychological torture, which is itself unacceptable in modern society.</p> <p>Finally, capital punishment confers no special benefit upon Japan. Proponents claim it deters crime, but, in fact, the death penalty has not been associated with decreased crime. The government should instead imprison people who commit heinous crimes for long periods of time and attempt rehabilitation. In the end, life imprisonment effectively keeps murderers off the streets.</p> <p>Capital punishment is a cruel torture that is unacceptable in today's world for myriad reasons. Given Japan's position as an advocate of democracy and human rights, the government should indeed abolish it.</p>
