Humankind should rely on science to solve its problems, particularly climate change, global food shortages, and world-ending events. These are potentially catastrophic issues threatening humanity's future that can only be addressed by putting our collective strength into scientific research.

First, the climate crisis continues to escalate. Heat records are broken every year, and ocean water levels are rising. Dramatically reducing greenhouse gas emissions from fossil fuel-based energy production is vital to combating these issues, and developing new energy technologies is the only realistic way to accomplish this.

Additionally, the global food supply depends on scientific innovation. Considering the limited amount of suitable farmland, access to food and water, for example, is fast becoming a serious issue. Science, however, is providing more efficient means of agriculture, such as urban farms and genetic modification, which will be key to avoiding such problems.

Finally, as with the extinction of the dinosaurs, apocalyptic events could wipe out humankind. While such threats may be less immediate than others, they cannot be neglected. Aerospace technologies are our only hope of preventing such disasters, and colonization of foreign planets, for instance, is a scientific goal that could provide a lifeboat in the worst-case scenario.

In this way, science is clearly the most effective tool to deal with the colossal problems related to energy, agriculture, and human extinction that the modern world faces. It is, therefore, incumbent upon world leaders to pour more resources into scientific research.
